DESIGN INTENT:

- Provision of shaded walking trails and revegetation to match that provided at Kensington Bushland.
- Revegetation of trees to contribute to Town of Victoria Park urban tree canopy targets.
- Plant and tree selection to provide shade, act as a food source and attract birds and fauna.
- All paths to be universally accessible and inclusive.
- Earth mounding to create interest.
- Provide all abilities connections to Kensington Bushland and Harold Rossiter Park.
- Provide seating opportunities.
- Provide interpretive signage and wayfinding.
- Central node acting as yarning circle/knowledge exchange.
- Selective removal of external fencing. Fencing strategies to be confirmed in detailed design.
- Feature elements may include boot cleaners, bird waterers and bird hides.
