Thanks to the Council for addressing this issue in the Fireworks Management Policy No 404. There are a number of concerns regarding use of fireworks which should be taken into account. The impact of the noise and light disruption on domestic animals within all areas is well known to pet owners. The impact on wildlife is evident when flocks of birds are heard and seen to be flying away from the area where fireworks are set off. There is a serious effect on water birds around the Swan River and other wetland sites as they are forced to leave the area and often do not survive the sudden need to do so: for example the quick crossing of roads and other suburban habitat sites by frightened native ducks. A major concern regarding fireworks near, around and on the Swan River is the pollution which falls directly into the river after the explosions and which has an immediate impact on fish life and water birds. Residents using the river for recreation may also be affected. As environmental preservation has become a global issue steps taken locally are vital for our future.
