

SAFER NEIGHBOURHOODS PLAN 2022-2027

Engagement Report

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Overview

The Safer Neighbourhoods Plan (SNP) guides the Town of Victoria Park in addressing crime and safety challenges impacting our community. From extensive community and stakeholder engagement undertaken as part of the review of the Town's current Community Strategic Plan, community safety and crime prevention were identified as top priorities.

The existing Safer Neighbourhoods Plan 2017-2022 (SNP) concluded in June 2022 and a new plan is now being developed for 2022-2027. The outgoing SNP has three objectives, which were based on the results of community and stakeholder engagement undertaken in 2016:

- Identify crime priorities of the area
- Reduce the impact of real and perceived crime in the Town
- Measure and record actions the Town undertakes to address crime priority areas

This report provides a snapshot of the consultation process undertaken to inform development of the SNP 2022-2027, what we have learned, who contributed, proposed approaches, and focus outcome areas.

Consultation process

The first phase of engagement occurred from February to June 2022, seeking feedback from community and key stakeholders on the following themes:

- An individual's feeling of safety in the Town and the nature of safety issues
- What the Town (and partners) can do to improve safety and reduce crime
- What the community can do themselves to improve safety and reduce crime
- Locations and places where crime and safety are a concern
- Priority areas to focus the new SNP



What we learned


Survey participant demographics

- Victoria Park and Carlisle. While making up 46% of the Town's population, this may suggest a higher level of interest in this topic within these localities. Victoria Park and Bentley had significantly lower response rates than expected, whereas engagement from St James, Lathlain and Burswood were proportionately represented
- Age range People 35 and older were more likely to engage with the survey.
 The proportion of responses based on age is not representative of the population
- Gender and relationship to the Town –
 Females responded twice as much as males, making up 2/3 of responses.
 Almost all were residents in the Town, and 5% were workers in the area



Survey key findings (see Appendix 1 for survey questions)

- Compared with 2016, 20% less people feel safe in the Town of Victoria Park
- People want more & brighter lighting for streets, laneways, and parks
- Residents would like initiatives that support vulnerable residents (especially seniors)
- People would like the Town Rangers and Police to be seen, as it is what makes them feel safe. Regular patrols, day and night, was a common request
- Speeding and road rage is a major issue. Residents want speed calming mechanisms installed, particularly in the streets near car yards and schools




Where do people feel unsafe?

Key outcome areas

Five key outcome areas have been established using this feedback, to achieve Safer Neighbourhoods in the Town of Victoria Park.



Infrastructure and environmental design

Improving lighting was the most requested action by the community, followed by improving roads and pedestrian safety. The Town aims to design public spaces to be safer, brighter, livelier, and more accessible.



Security and regulatory initiatives

Through funding and education programs, the Town aims to empower residents, businesses, and community groups to contribute to reducing crime. We will continue to provide visible Ranger Services that focus on community safety concerns.



Community connection and social cohesion

The Town aims to build capacity and connections within our community, and in doing so, support vulnerable and at-risk groups. We will engage in and collaborate with other organisations to provide early intervention, outreach, support, and rehabilitation services.



Advocacy and partnering

Sharing information and working together was identified as key in addressing the Safer Neighbourhoods priorities. The whole is greater than the sum of its parts, so the Town will collaborate with Local, State, and Federal agencies, and also encourage community members to report crime and safety issues.



Governance and impact

Monitoring and evaluating the outcomes of our programs and initiatives is vital in ensuring that we are making a positive difference in the community, and that we are focused on current crime and safety priorities.
