

5 PUBLIC QUESTION TIME

Neil Kidd

- 1. Will the intersection of Great Eastern Highway and Victoria Park Drive be a left in left out only? Can council confirm if that is the case?
- R. The Chief Executive Officer, Mr Anthony Vuleta said that he was of the understanding that you will be able to travel across from Burswood Road to Victoria Park Drive in a Northerly direction only. It's left out, as you come back down Victoria Park Drive, heading towards Great Eastern Highway.
- 2. So residents will not be able to cross back over into Burswood Road?
- R. The Chief Executive Officer, Mr Anthony Vuleta said that was correct, but you will be able to cross the other way.

Rick Indrisie

- 1. With regards to the Child Care Centre, being proposed for Teddington Street, where do the operators envisage 80 parents would park their cars, whilst they drop their kids off and pick them up from the centre?
- R. The Executive Manager Built Life, Mr Robert Cruickshank said that the applicant's proposal, while seeking approval for a maximum of 85 children, essentially indicates from their experience operating such facilities, that generally, these facilities operate at 80% of their capacity. So the applicant suggested the actual demand will be less

than the 80 children, at any one time. However in addition to that, the whole basis or rationale behind this proposal is its location, close to a commercial centre and close to residential area. So the applicant through their own assessment and through their traffic impact assessment is of the view that a reasonable proportion of the patronage, will actually come from people who either work or reside nearby, so there will be walking patronage. The application proposes 16 onsite car bays, so they're available, as well as that there is likely to be parking and availability on Teddington Road. So through a combination of those, the applicant believes there is sufficient parking provided. Council officers are also satisfied, having received a traffic impact report from the applicant.

- 2. Can you clarify whether the laneway has been suggested as a route for an avenue to drop and pick up children?
- R. The Executive Manager Built Life, Mr Robert Cruickshank advised that the applicant's proposal does make provision for vehicle access off the laneway, be it for both staff parking and for drop offs for children. Some background is that the applicant originally proposed for drop off facility off Teddington Road, however the Council's policy and vision for the Causeway Precinct is essentially to have no vehicle access off the principal road, such as Teddington Road, and to make use of the available rights of way at the rear. So that's essentially an objective that Council is seeking throughout the whole Causeway Precinct, where there are rights of way available and where they are available they should be used for vehicle access, rather than the main street. So in terms of some of the current operational issues that currently exist within the right of way, if people are parking in the right of way or blocking the right of way, then that's not authorised and is something that needs to be brought to Council's attention and suitable enforcement action be taken by the Town's Rangers to stop that from happening.

- 1. Is there anything going to be done with the box on the corner of Duncan Street and Shepperton Road that is overgrown with grass and littered with rubbish?
- R. The Director Renew Life Program, Mr Warren Bow took the question on notice.
- 2. Have you been contacted regarding the passing of Milton 'Snow' Fairclough and have there been any arrangements to honour him in your speech on Remembrance Day?
- R. Mayor Trevor Vaughan advised that the Town is aware of Milton 'Snow' Fairclough's passing and advised Mr Crann that it has been included in the speech on the day.
- 3. Has any arrangements been made, if you're going under the same circumstances of having people standing under the tree, rather than in front of the memorial, is that going to be repeated?
- R. Mayor Trevor Vaughan said the Administration has looked at the shade and believes something is being done about it.
- 4. Is there a possibility, as this is the centenary of WW1, can the white crosses have printed on them, the names of the battlefields of WW1, to help children understand what that war was about?
- R. The Chief Executive Officer, Mr Anthony Vuleta took the question on notice.

- 5. Is it possible, with the various Christmas Street decorations, last year the final figure was \$75,000. There were a number of banners that a lot of money was spent on, that are sitting at the depot, unused; could those banners be issued to the various painters that Council uses to depict Christmas greetings, pictures or scenery and put in the middle of the highway rather than bare poles and excessive lighting, which is quite extreme and quite expensive?
- R. The Chief Executive Officer, Mr Anthony Vuleta took the question on notice.

- 1. Are the three (3) 5 minutes parking bays set back from the road or are they normal parking bays at the kerbside?
- R. The Executive Manager Built Life, Mr Robert Cruickshank said these are bays on the street, within the road reserve. On page 31 there is an aerial photo, which you can see cars parked on the street, at the adjoining property at 34-36 Teddington St.

- 2. Have the traffic consultants expressed any concerns with people loading or unloading children on the traffic side of these vehicles? Have the traffic consultants considered these sorts of issues?
- R. The Executive Manager Built Life, Mr Robert Cruickshank advised that the traffic report was prepared by the applicant and submitted to Council. In that report it certainly recognised that the likelihood, notwithstanding the vehicular access of the right of way, that a significant proportion of patrons would park their car on Teddington Road, given the convenience in doing so. However, there was no indication in that report or any concerns expressed about the safety of children in doing so. There is 16 car bays that are provided on site at the moment, that comply with Council's requirement, so the likelihood that patrons are going to park on the street, is in addition to what the application needs to provide.
- 3. With regards to the traffic flow and a roundabout at Teddington and Burswood Road; is that something that is still going to be progressing with?
- R. The Director Renew Life Program, Mr Warren Bow said that is the ultimate design outcome for that intersection, however, the Administration was unsuccessful in obtaining the relevant funding to progress that design, but there will be some modifications to that intersection and a change in priority. Mr Bow will provide that information to Elected Members and added that in effect from Teddington Road at the intersection of Burswood Road, priority would be given to right turning vehicles from Teddington into Burswood Road and there will be a give way along Burswood Road, traveling along Burswood Road at that intersection.
- 4. On page 26 it mentions that Council's Parking Management Team, has not currently supported the exclusive use of two (2) car parking bays on Teddington Road for the proposed Day Care Centre, with it being acknowledged that the parking and traffic impact and implementing any necessary parking management measures could be reviewed on commencement of the use; does that mean that after the business is up and running are we going to assess that and determine that maybe that wasn't a good idea and Council will stop them using it? Is that a possibility and how does that affect the number of parking bays available?
- R. The Executive Manager Built Life, Mr Robert Cruickshank said the applicant in their submission was seeking approval for the car bays out the front of Teddington Road to be marked for their exclusive use and be time limited. However, the Parking Management Team essentially said that at this particular time, they are not prepared to allow those bays to be marked for the exclusive use of the premises or to be time limited and they will review that aspect of the development in six (6 to 12 months' time, once the business is operating. So the point to be made there is that it is recognised by everyone, including the Parking Management Team that people are going to park on the street, it's just at this point in time, Council is not going to allow them to have those bays marked for their own exclusive use.
- 5. In condition 1.8, it talks about landscaping of onsite and on the verge; under what authority or power can the Town withhold building permits, conditional upon a developer landscaping a verge that doesn't belong to them?
- R. The Executive Manager Built Life, Mr Robert Cruickshank said it is a standard requirement, however will take that question on notice.

Item 11.2 Application to Amend the Burswood Lakes Structure Plan in Relation to Lots 9 and 9525 Victoria Park Drive, Burswood

- 1. It was suggested by the proponent's planners that the Design Review Committee (DRC) have looked at this proposal three (3) times, is this the same proposal or has it been different proposals?
- R. The Executive Manager Built Life, Mr Robert Cruickshank said yes, there has been three (3) occasions that the DRC'S reviewed proposals for this site. The initial DRC was to review the proposal as originally submitted by the applicant. The DRC gave some feedback at that time, looking for some design modifications and some design changes to be made. Mr Cruickshanks recalls that the second meeting was the one where the applicant came back with some amended plans, which responded to the initial comment that the DRC made. Mr Cruickshank believes again there were some further matters and items of details that were commented on again by DRC so the applicant went away and made some amendments to that and it came back for further discussions. So it has been a progression of improvements or changes to plans over those three (3) meetings.
- 2. So this is just in the last round, because I understand that this site has had a number of quite substantial proposals over the years; is this just this current proposal that there has been three (3) meetings?
- R. The Executive Manager Built Life, Mr Robert Cruickshank said yes.
- 3. Are we looking tonight at a proposal to change the developments standards or are we looking at a Development Application?
- R. The Executive Manager Built Life, Mr Robert Cruickshank advised this was a proposal to change the structure plan so it is to change the development standards that apply. If the structure plan amendment was to be approved by the WA Planning Commission (WAPC) then that would essentially mean that a DA would come thereafter.
- 4. Mr Kidd in his summary at the end, proposed a possible strengthening up of the officer's report; are the proposals that Mr Kidd put forward issues that could be entertained and could they be considered before the report comes back to Council?
- R. The Executive Manager Built Life, Mr Robert Cruickshank advised that he believes the Officer's recommendation adequately covers all the issues. Mr Cruickshank said that the Administration can give some further thought to Mr Kidd's comments and the Elected Members comments and the applicant's comments, but at this point in time, Mr Cruickshank is happy with what is before the Elected Members.
- 5. Would Mr Kidd have the opportunity to present to Officer's in more detail before the Ordinary Council Meeting?
- R. The Executive Manager Built Life, Mr Robert Cruickshank said yes.

- 6. When did we last talk to the Department of Planning (DoP) about Local Structure Plan for Burswood Station East and what can the Town do?
- R. The Director Future Life and Built Life Program, Ms Rochelle Lavery advised that she did speak to DOP as recently as two (2) weeks ago. At this stage they are saying that it's a political decision, so it's certainly not the fault of the applicants that they can't proceed and it's certainly not the fault of the Council. The Administration even offered to provide consultants to assist the Department, when they ran out of money to proceed with the Burswood Station West Masterplan. It did get caught up in the stadium being added to the Burswood Peninsula. Ms Lavery said she can't get a clear answer on what's holding it up right now.

- 1. Have the people that put in submissions in for McMaster Street been advised it's coming to council? Would this property sit within the GEN3 policy or another document?
- R. The Executive Manager Built Life, Mr Robert Cruickshank advised that this policy is dealing with Consultation and planning proposals, so this policy would not capture the situation of McMaster Street. The situation in McMaster Street and the consultation requirements for that, are covered by Council Policy Gen3, which will still remain. So as has been pointed out and flagged, when the Administration review Gen3 in the future, it probably needs to include that or even suggesting as an interim practice, regardless of what the policy says, as it currently stands, the Administration should be doing that.
- R. The Director Future Life and Built Life Program, Ms Rochelle Lavery added that in regards to McMaster Street, although it's not the item that is being dealt with, she is advised that all people that made submissions were advised that the item was coming to Council, which is why the gentleman that made a statement earlier, turned up this evening. However, there was not enough time and the Administration didn't have all the email address to advise these people that the matter had been withdrawn, so those people were advised by registered mail.

Questions / Responses:

- 1. Where do the boundaries of responsibility with this project fall between the Town of Victoria Park, Main Roads and the Burswood Park Board?
- R. The Director Renew Life Program, Mr Warren Bow said that his understanding was that the prior engagement with Main Roads and Burswood Park Board clearly indicated that this aspect of the project was the Town's responsibility, it doesn't impact on the bridge or the carriage way, which runs along the top of the cycle way underneath and it is also within the Town of Victoria Park on the Western side of the Causeway, so it's the Town's responsibility.

- With regards to condition 2 of the recommendation, that the surplus be allocated to the Buildings Renew Reserve; can the recommendation be strengthened that the Finance and Audit Committee look at the surplus and make a recommendation back to Council regarding whether that money sit in reserve or whether it be carried forward for projects for consideration in the 2016/17 or 2017/18 budget for it to be spent, rather than just going in there and nothing happening? Would that be appropriate?
- R. The Director Renew Life Program, Mr Warren Bow advised that was one of the considerations when that was considered when formulating the recommendation, so with Council's consent, Mr Bow would be happy to change Condition 2 of the recommendation to read that the surplus funds be referred to Finance and Audit Committee for consideration.
- 2. On page 103, is this suggesting that this building here is only expected to last 20 years?
- R. The Director Renew Life Program, Mr Warren Bow said that he believes that is an error and should be based on the useful life of the mechanical services being 20 years. The Town's useful life and depreciation for the buildings is over a 40 year term. Mr Bow said he will check and get clarification on that figure.

- 3. Does this proposal include the replacement of everything, the ducting, the vent and controllers or just the mechanical parts?
- R. The Director Renew Life Program, Mr Warren Bow said he is of the understanding that it is the entire system, including the controllers and duct work, but will confirm that.

- 1. Is there an update on the progress of the kitchen facilities and the ablution facilities at Edward Millen House?

- R. The Director Renew Life Program, Mr Warren Bow said no, he doesn't know where the sign has gone and yes, he will follow it up.
