

# **Community Benefits Strategy Overview 2020**

In what has been a challenging year in all facets of life in particular community engagement. The West Coast Eagles (WCE) are proud of the connection and impact we have been able to achieve with the Town of Victoria Park Community Benefits Strategy (CBS). Both parties, working hand in hand to reach outcomes in a changing landscape.

#### **West Coast Eagles Representative Hours**

With limited player availability due to COVID-19, AFL protocols governing the Men's and Women's playing squad and large amount of time from March to October where staff were stood down, and only returning in a part time capacity until January 4<sup>th</sup>, when the team returned to full time work. We were still able to adapt as required to achieve the majority of the required allotment of 100 player hours, reaching 94.5 hours.

### **Supporting Local Community Organization's**

Under the CBS, WCE engaged with 4 not-for-profit organizations within the Town of Victoria Park:

- 1. Western Australia Disability Sporting Association
- 2. Lathlain Playgroup
- 3. Kensington PCYC
- 4. Healthy Strides OT Clinic

A survey was conducted late 2019 to assess which organization's (including both local community organizations and recreational and sporting clubs) we believed we could add most value to working collaboratively with. The relationship built with each organization and their clients in the first 12 months was a highlight, having significant impact on their well-being, none more evident than the relationship built at Healthy Strides, working with a young man named Logan. This particular relationship has been documented via the club's website, titled 'Strides Together'.

We look forward to continuing these relationships in the next four years with a particular focus to improve the connection with the Kensington PCYC who had some leadership changeover during the 2020 year, which limited our engagement with them.

#### **Recreational Groups and Sports Club Development**

Given the sport and recreation clubs within the area (after completing the survey) we were able to reach out to 28 community clubs within the Town of Victoria Park multiple times throughout the year, with six reaching back for assistance:

- 1. Victoria Park Junior Football Club (VPJFC)
- 2. Carlisle Football Club
- 3. Victoria Park Soccer Club
- 4. Perth Royals Soccer Club
- 5. Vic Park Curtin Cricket Club
- 6. Victoria Park Little Athletics Club

Of the six we shared a particularly close relationship with VPJFC in many different facets. Whether it be hands on training, event collaboration or donation items. VPJFC hosted our Naitanui Cup in November, which enabled them to showcase their facilities. It was a highly successful night in regards to community engagement. We look forward to further growing our relationships with the six clubs we have engaged with, whilst also building new relationships and providing support to other Sports and Recreational Clubs in the area. For example we aim to target the district level clubs such as Perth Redbacks Basketball and Cricket clubs, who have junior feeder clubs attached to them.

#### **Healthy Relationship Awareness**

The healthy relationships component of the CBS has been primarily based around raising awareness as well as promoting behaviors that are in line with the values held by the Healthy Relationship Strategy Group, within the Town of Victoria Park. A campaign to eliminate domestic violence against women was the center point of the healthy relationship strategy group's partnership with WCE. The 16 days in WA event along with video releases and working group meetings have been the predominant involvements. WCE have been an active participant in strategy group meetings, hosting one later in the year at Mineral Resources Park, which for the most part of the year was off limits to the external visitors, due to the COVID-19 protocols governing the competition. The inaugural year of the Community Benefits Strategy has been one of great learning and achievement, together we were awarded the <u>community-based initiative of the year at the 2020 Parks and Leisure National Awards of excellence</u>. A key to its success was all working groups having the flexibility to adapt to the problems that arose, whilst keeping open lines of communication constant throughout.

Our focus going ahead is ensuring the strategy will maintain the West Coast Eagles brand, having the same, if not greater impact it has had in the first year as it does when reviewed at the 5 year mark. Allowing for adaptability and a best fit approach for the variety of Town of Victoria Park groups that are engaged in the strategy in regard to West Coast Eagles.

We look forward to working with the Town of Victoria Park in 2021.
