Carlisle and Victoria Park AFLW Ducks Incorporated are requesting funding for two new AFL Goal Posts. They are nine metres by six metre AFL Goal Posts with hinge bases.

They are the first all-female AFL club to be registered with the Western Australian Football Commission and they train at an oval without a goal post. With a goal post up it allows them to train and be able to host home games. It will allow engagement with the club members families and the community to come and watch them play footy.

A conditional part of the funding will be that the club must provide a sitemap to indicate positioning and further details related to the installation and management of the goal posts.

**Panel Assessment:**

- Supports participation in AFL, including an increase in training and competitions on a local Town reserve, creating further community engagement and connectedness.
- The Panel supports the project, with the condition that the Town has final say on installation of the goals, pending a site investigation to ensure there is no impact on existing infrastructure and community engagement levels.
- The project supports sport participation for one of the Town's priority populations, Women, who need additional support for the establishment and development of their sporting pathways.
- The project is likely to increase broader community sport engagement and participation outcomes for the sport, including usage by other Clubs and general local community members and groups.

**The panel recommends project funding of \$2,000.00 (25% of cost)**
