Post of social media – removing very large Mari tree on private property.

Can a letter or can we make contact with the owner/landowner or developer advocate the tree retention? Did we advertise the tree retention policy – awareness of what can be done. Comms around what the Town can do broadly.

Contact planning

Cr D: UFS grants – aware of grant that could be used to buy a full size tree about \$6,000.DB: The panel agreed that it was not appropriate and make note to refine the criteria on the grant application to ensure we don't support, through grant funds, trees above 500 ltr.

Cr Ife – Community member wanting to replace verge tree and told that it was not dead and therefore would not be replaced. GW: Information was not correct, can trim. We will not ever removing a healthy tree.
